

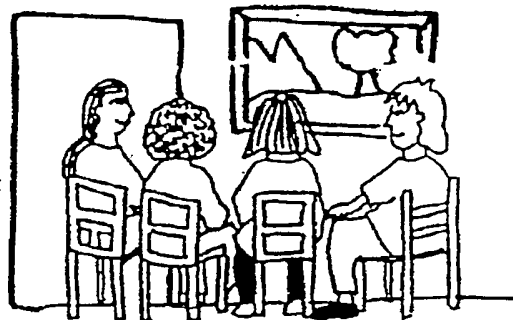
## 13 Parents gave their feedback about What's going Well / What's not going Well regarding Reviews – Planning for adulthood for their teenagers 1.2.12

### What's going well: ☺

- Parents appreciate the support of the Learning Disability / Difficulties Advisers (Youth Employability Service) regarding sorting out going on to college.



- When schools take time to prepare young people for their transition. For example, Hillside take students to visit Downs View Link College to help the students get used to it, before they transfer from school to college.
- Parents appreciate it when meetings are relaxed and friendly and when their expectations and hopes for their teens are discussed.

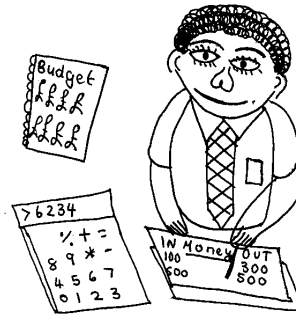


## What's not going well:

- Parents feel that school and college don't know enough about the options available once their teenagers leave education. They also felt that schools weren't very good at thinking about all aspects of their child's future for example: housing, social lives, jobs, health.



- It's hard to plan when parents and young people have no idea what the options are early enough. They don't know what amount of money their young person will be allocated before they reach 18. Parents said they find thinking about the future 'very scary'.



- Parents said they don't think schools do enough to help prepare them or the young person for their review meetings. Noone thought the review meetings at their child's school were 'person-centred', some said their children weren't even invited. Parents say they, or their children don't have clear Action Plans of who will do what and when it will happen
