Valuing People Now: a new three year strategy for people with learning disabilities
Making it happen for everyone



Valuing People Now says the Director of Adult Social Services in the City Council and the Chief Executive of the Primary Care Trust must make sure that we have a Learning Disability Partnership Board. We are the Partnership Board and this is who we are.

At least half of our membership must be people with learning disabilities or family carers. They represent the views of all people with learning disabilities and family carers in the city.

The Brighton & Hove Learning Disability Partnership Board has 21 membership spaces.

- 7 are members because of their job or position
- 14 are members because they are elected or chosen to represent a group of people
- 11 members are people with learning disabilities or family carers

All members are expected to attend Partnership Board meetings or send their deputy in their place.

All members are responsible to the people or organisation they represent.

All members are expected to use their influence and the influence of those they represent to make Valuing People Now happen in Brighton & Hove.

City Councillor Co-chair

Expected to:

- Plan and run our meetings
- Give high level support to the Partnership Board
- Be a link into the executive functions of the City Council
- Understand the bigger picture within the City Council

Method of Selection: The council's cabinet decide which councillor has the lead for learning disabilities and that councillor is asked to co-chair the Partnership Board.

People with Learning Disabilities

- Speak up for people with learning disabilities in Brighton & Hove
- Give a personal view and experiences
- Attend Link Group meetings and the advocacy groups network Big Meetings
- Report to the Big Meeting about the work of the Partnership Board
- Help the Partnership Board and its sub groups come up with solutions to issues and questions that come up at the Big Meeting

Method of Selection: selected by the advocacy groups network to represent them on the Partnership Board.

Family Carers of People with Learning Disabilities

The family carers on the Partnership Board are called the 'Carers' Link Group'.

Expected to:

- Speak on behalf of families of people with learning disabilities
- Provide personal view and experiences



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- Be a link into family organisations in the city that work with families of people with learning disabilities
- Attend and help plan carers meetings that are open to all carers of people with learning disabilities
- Report to the carers' networks & meetings about the work of the Partnership Board
- Help the Partnership Board and it's sub groups come up with solutions to issues and questions that come up at the carers' networks & meetings

Method of Selection: selected by carers meetings and networks to represent them on the Partnership Board.

Expected to:

- Represent views of commissioned providers of services for adults with learning disabilities in Brighton & Hove
- Attend Learning Disability Providers' Forum meetings
- Report to the Providers' Forum about the work of the Partnership Board

Method of Selection: selected by the Learning Disability Providers' Forum to represent them on the Partnership Board

Community & Voluntary Sector Representative

Expected to:

- Represent views of voluntary sector providers in Brighton & Hove
- Attend Community & Voluntary Sector Forum meetings
- Report to the Community & Voluntary Sector Forum about the work of the Partnership Board

Method of Selection: elected by the Community & Voluntary Services Forum to represent them on the Partnership Board

Health & Social Care Services

Council's Director of Adult Social Services

Expected to:

- Provide the formal link into the City Council and Adult Social Services
- Represent learning disabilities at high level meetings in social and community services
- Keep the Partnership Board informed of changes within Adult Social Services

Method of Selection: membership is based on job role

- Provide a link with Brighton & Hove Primary Care Trust and partner health organisations, including primary and secondary care
- bring and take away issues for health regarding people with learning disabilities
- provide a link into the wider work of the Department of Health regarding mainstream health services used by people with learning disabilities
- have good knowledge of how the Primary Care Trust works across its directorates
